Maurice Brubaker is a candidate in the Republican Party for the 85th District State House seat. Since the beginning of his campaign in late January, He has repeatedly identified himself in official campaign press releases and verbally in public forums as a "Public Accountant." His official campaign website lists this title as one of His qualifications. Title 49, Chapter 11.7 of the PA Code declares unequivocally that only individuals holding a current license from the Department of State may "use the designation 'public accountant,' the abbreviation 'PA,' or any other title, designation, words, letters or abbreviation tending to indicate that the user is a public accountant." Maurice's Father, Robert Maurice Brubaker is listed on the DOS website as holding a public accountant license since 1979. Maurice Brubaker does not hold a current license for Public Accounting. Maurice verbally identified himself as a public accountant in his remarks at two Republican gatherings both witnesses attended. The latest was April 29th before a crowd of about 80 people including two current State Representatives and the current candidates for the CD10 race.

J. RESOLUTION.

How would you like this complaint to be resolved?

1. Maurice Brubaker should immediately cease from issuing press releases or referring to himself verbally as a Public Accountant.

2. Maurice Brubaker should send a press release to all local media outlets to which he previously directed campaign-related releases. This new release should state clearly that He is NOT a Public Accountant, nor has he been one for the last 15 years. He should state that His prior press releases and public comments were not consistent with PA Law concerning Public Accounting.

- (1) An individual who holds a public accountant registration and a current license from the Board.
- (2) An individual who holds a certificate of certified public accountant from the Board or who has received written notification from the Board that he is qualified to receive a certificate of certified public accountant.
- (3) A qualified association that holds a current license from the Board.

(b) An individual or qualified association engaged in the practice of public accounting may not use the designation "public accountant," the abbreviation "PA" or any other title, designation, words, letters or abbreviation tending to indicate that the user is a public accountant or composed of public accountants unless the user holds a current license from the Board.

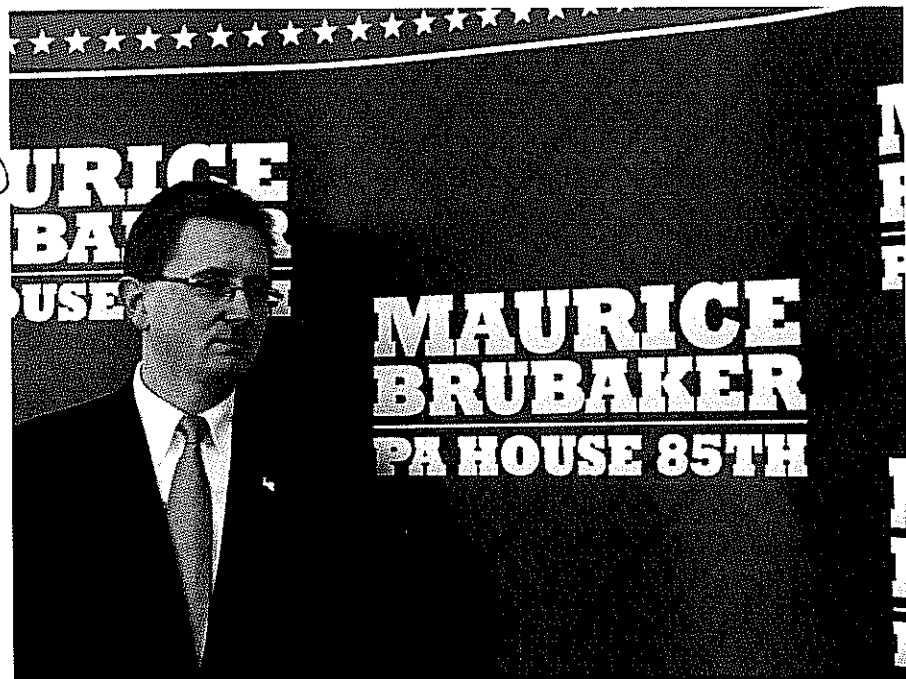

Lewisburg public accountant says he can make a difference in the district

LEWISBURG – Lewisburg Public Accountant Maurice Brubaker thinks he can make a difference, and that's the basis for his decision to run for the 85th district house seat. The Republican made his official announcement Wednesday to seek the seat being vacated by Russ Fairchild (R-85th, Winfield).

Brubaker says he wants to continue with many of the positive changes Fairchild has made to the district and also has important ideas of his own, including bringing jobs to the region, working to get the CSVT built and keeping I-80 toll free.

Brubaker has been a public accountant for 15 years. He is co-owner of Brubaker's Clothier in Lewisburg, is the president of the Central Keystone Council of Government Board and is the treasurer of the Lewisburg Downtown Partnership. Snyder County resident and Conestoga Wood plant operations manager Fred Keller is the only other person so far who has announced plans to run for this seat. (Sara Bartlett)

Former U.S. Attorney making a run for 10th Congressional District

WILLIAMSPORT – Former U.S. Attorney Tom Marino says this isn't the first time he has thought about a run for 10th Congressional District, but in today's economy it's necessary to get someone in Washington that can produce results. Marino made the announcement Wednesday to seek the Republican nomination to challenge Democratic Representative Chris Carney (R-10th, Dimock).

The 57-year-old Williamsport native is a former district attorney in Lycoming County and served as the top federal prosecutor for central and northeastern Pennsylvania between 2002 and 2007. Marino says there is far too much spending in Washington. Another important issue to him is taking a stand on healthcare, and not letting the government make his healthcare decisions.

Marino says if elected, he will spend as little time in Washington as possible, and much of his time in the 10th Congressional District, because that's where his constituents are best served. Several Republicans are expected to enter the race to challenge Carney. Snyder County Commissioner Malcolm Derk has already announced his intentions to run. (Sara Bartlett)

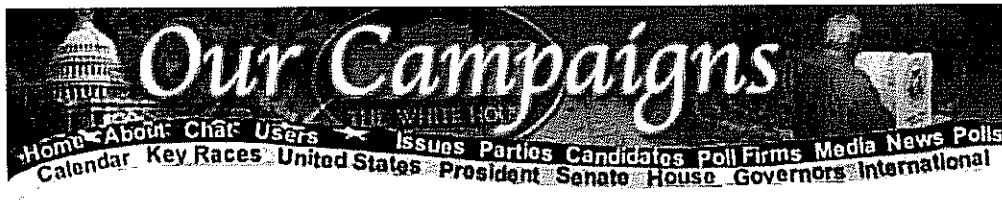

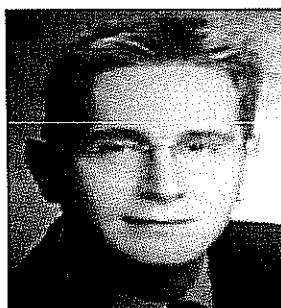

STREET TALK: Candidate meets farmers

Maurice Brubaker, a candidate for the 85th District, recently met with both the Union County and Snyder County Farm Bureau executive boards. He announced his plans to form a local farm advisory board to keep him apprised of important issues that need to be communicated in Harrisburg. He also announced he will institute Saturday office hours to be accessible to all of his constituents.

Also discussed at the meeting was the current pension shortfall and budget deficit in Pennsylvania. Brubaker, a public accountant for the past 15 years, shared ideas to facilitate property tax relief and to assist small businesses with tax breaks.

Middleburg man seeks state committee post

Mark J. Harris, of Middleburg, is seeking reelection as the Snyder County Republican State Committee member.

He has been a member of the state committee for four years, two years as the chairman.

"When it comes to representing the voters of Snyder County, I believe I hold their views and values far more than my opponent," Harris said.

He was speaking of Patricia L. Saylor, of Beavertown, who previously ran against him for the same seat.

Harris said he supports a vision of inclusion, not exclusion.

"I believe the party is formed by like-minded people," he said. "It's not just a power base to influence the masses."

While some may see the state committee members as "nothing more than glorified cheerleaders," Harris said he believes it is also important for the person in that position to help with "governing what the elected officials are up to."

Harris said he represents Snyder County people and their values, such as the culture of life, the sanctity of marriage, the right to keep and bear arms, a smaller and less intrusive government, moral and ethical leadership, and fiscally responsible government.

On a state level, Harris has advocated for transparency and open records.

2 eye 85th seat

SUNBURY — Two Valley residents announced Thursday their intentions to seek state legislative seats in the 85th districts. Maurice Brubaker, a Lewisburg accountant and clothing store owner, said he'd like to use the same approach as state Rep. Russ Fairchild, who will retire Dec. 31. "Russ' integrity, common-sense approach to issues, and attention to the needs of this district have served all of us well and I look forward to continuing and building on those standards," Brubaker said. A lifelong Union County resident and public accountant for more than 15 years, Brubaker said he understands the challenges the Valley faces in improving the economy and infrastructure, building the Central Susquehanna Valley Thruway and addressing its rural needs. "I will make job growth a top priority," he said. "This will not be an easy task and it cannot be done overnight, but let me be clear, I will be relentless. "We need Harrisburg to understand the needs of those who live and work in rural Pennsylvania. It is time to look at Harrisburg's open checkbook policies to cities and municipal governments who year after year need help and bailouts due to improper policies and corrupt management." A former Republican State Committee member, Brubaker is president of Keystone Council of Governments and treasurer of Lewisburg Downtown Partnership. Another candidate, Frederick Keller, 44, of Middleburg, said Thursday night that he wanted to "serve the people of the 85th district in the same good way that Russ Fairchild has." Keller, plant operations manager for Conestoga Wood Specialties, in Beavertown, said: "My heart has always been in public service." He has just completed a six-year elected term as Middlecreek Township auditor and said that he has worked in various local and statewide campaigns. His top priorities would be jobs and the economy. "We've seen job losses in the area and obviously, bringing businesses to the area is extremely important," he said. Keller is a deacon at the First Reform Church in Sunbury. Meanwhile, in Northumberland County, a former aide to retiring state Rep. Merle Phillips says he has formed an exploratory committee to determine if he should launch a campaign for the Republican nomination in the 108th Legislative District. "As a resident of Northumberland County, I have a vested interest in the continued growth and economic progress of this region," said David A. Comes, of Dalmatia. "Through Merle Phillips, I have become very familiar with the people and the issues facing the 108th district. My desire to carry on his vision has led me to consider a run for his seat in the Pennsylvania House of Representatives." Northumberland County Controller Charles Erdman Jr. has already announced he is running for the GOP nomination in the 108th District.
